Music:

'Find the Beat'

Children will find a beat in different styles of music, tapping a beat back and understanding why a beat is important.

The Jolly Postman

English:

In English, the children will be exploring the journeys the Jolly Postman makes. We will be using drama strategies and discussions to increase vocabulary and work together to build word banks and ideas for the children to use independently. The children will be learning to construct sentences remembering to use key features of punctuation (capital letters, finger spaces, full stops). Children will be encouraged to use their phonics when reading and writing and show a neat handwriting style.

RSHE:

Children will learn the importance of keeping themselves safe and why rules and routines are important.

Art and Design Technology:

We will be completing land art focusing on the artist Andy Goldsworthy. We will read and share the story *Leaf Man* to support us.

We will also make moveable pictures in DT.

Maths:

In maths, children will be exploring the place value of numbers across 20. Children will be encouraged to; *sort and group objects to count, *count forwards and backwards from 0-20 / 20-0 *order numbers in and out of order *form all number correctly, starting at the correct place *solve addition and subtraction calculations across IO

Geography:

Children will begin to explore maps in a variety of forms and begin to talk about the importance of them. Children will practise reading and following maps as well as making their own. Children will be exposed to geographical language to describe different features when going on a journey (our local area). Children will begin to learn the countries of the UK.

Children will learn to:
