Year 2 Project Based Curriculum



In Autumn term, children learn about the Victorians. We focus on what life was like for children in this period. We will also explore how Norwich castle has changed over time.



During Spring term, we learn about local, significant figures including the likes of Horatio Nelson and Edith Cavell. In the second half-term children will investigate the uses of water and the importance of conserving it.



In Summer term, children explore African rainforests focusing on animals and how to protect them. Finally we will compare farming in Egypt to farming in Norfolk.

Importance of Reading

Children will have daily phonics lessons using the FFT scheme we follow.



Library books will come home weekly which can be read to your child to listen to and enjoy.

Phonics books will come home which will have words your child is able to sound and blend.

Children will practise applying their phonics knowledge when reading during guided reading sessions and I:I reading with an adult.

Reading at home to your child will help them to develop a love for books. Regularly listening to your child read at home will help them practise and embed skills they are learning at school.

How we teach English

-As a class we will explore quality texts throughout the year. Year 2 begin by sharing 'Daisy Saves the Day' by Shirley Hughes

- We will use strategies that include drama and discussion to develop vocabulary and promote using our imagination.
- Children will be encouraged to use their phonics to spell words and formulate sentences. Children will practise spellings during phonics and English lessons in line with the curriculum. We will keep you informed of your child's spellings on Tapestry so you can continue practise at home.

- Children will leave Year 2 with a greater understanding of punctuation such as capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and question <u>marks.</u>

How we teach Maths

 Children will use resources, methods and discussions that promote high level understanding of mathematical concepts. These include counting, adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying.

 Children will learn to count to IOO both forwards and backwards as well as learn to count in steps of 2, 5 and IO. Children also begin to skip count by 3.

– Children will learn about fractions, geometry and measures.

Ways you may like to support with maths at home: Count forwards and back to 100 by counting your steps, jumps, throwing and catching.

Practise writing numbers and work on ensuring correct formation and direction.

Enhance the curriculum

- Children will participate in whole school curriculum days/weeks. These include learning Shakespeare week and Maths Week England.
- At Christmas, children will have the chance to perform during our festive performance.
- There will also be many trips for the children to enjoy across the year, these include a trip to Gressenhall, a trip to a farm and history walk around Norwich!
