




Project Based Curriculum


In project lessons, we will be finding out about the Antarctic, the Maya, Texas and deserts, the civil rights movement, and volcanoes and earthquakes.







Importance of Reading



English text, class reader, extracts used in reading sessions, interventions, texts used across other curriculum subjects, etc.

How we teach English

English is taught daily for one hour. In addition to this, we also have a 30 minute reading session each day.

For writing, we use modelled writing, scaffolds and shared ideas in order for us to write independently.

We make sure that the children know the purpose of their writing (to inform, to entertain, to persuade, etc.) and the intended audience.

We use a phonics-based approach to teaching spelling, and teach and practise letter formation alongside this.

Feedback is given in a variety of ways, both during the lessons and afterwards.

How we teach Maths

Maths is taught daily for one hour. In addition to this, we may also practise number facts as part of our registration work.

We want to encourage the children to become confident with these and the quick recall of times tables, as being able to do this is essential in most areas of maths.

We will be working on improving the children's calculation skills with an emphasis on applying their understanding through reasoning and problem solving.

Children will be expected to show their understanding of number and other mathematical concepts through oral and written explanations, focusing on the 'why' of maths, as well as just finding the answer.

While we are not teaching simply to pass tests, children will be given increasing test experience as we get closer to the summer term.

What children can do at home to keep a good routine for learning

Read daily.

Practise spellings.



Times table practice, including TTRockstars and Hit the Button.

Use the half-termly overview grids as discussion points, quizzes, etc.

Get a good night's sleep!

Little and often!

PE and games sessions will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Fitness is daily, however, so trainers are needed each day.

Toys, stationery, etc. should be kept at home, please.

Children are to be dropped off and collected on playgrounds. Scooters and cycles are not to be used on school property.


